

The Carnegie Mellon University Ballroom Dance Club (CMUBDC) is both a social organization, with beginner lessons and social dance events, and a dance school, offering professionally-taught dance lessons in a large variety of Ballroom and Latin dances. The club consists of Carnegie Mellon University students (undergraduate and graduate) and members of the Pittsburgh Community.



People — Our club's members range from those with two left feet (and sometimes more) to veteran dancers with years of experience. We welcome anyone interested in learning and having fun, including Pittsburgh area undergraduate students, graduate students, and professionals.

Dances — We base our lessons on the International Latin (Cha-Cha, Rumba, Samba, Paso Doble, Jive) and Standard (Waltz, Tango, Foxtrot, Quickstep, Viennese Waltz) dances, but we also teach social dances like Salsa, Hustle, and Lindy Hop, as well as American Smooth and American Rhythm styles.

Social Events — In addition to the social dancing during our weekly lessons, we also hold themed social dances several times throughout the year and everyone is welcome! A variety of music is played throughout the night. It's a great way to get to know the club members and dance the night away. We also have social gatherings in and around the greater Pittsburgh area to promote club and team bonding!

Competition Team — The competition team is a great chance to push yourself to the next level, and to dance with a group of talented and highly motivated people. Novice and expert dancers are welcome, as competitions have levels ranging from Newcomer to Champ, and you register for the dances suitable for your level.

Ruslan Wilder began his dance career at 6 in St. Petersburg, Russia, gaining prominence as an amateur before moving to the United States in 1997. After marrying Katusha Wilder in 2002, they both continued to excel in DanceSport, securing numerous top titles internationally, including roles as U.S. Representatives at World Professional International Standard and 10 Dance Championships, and as finalists in both World Professional 10 Dance and U.S. Professional Rising Star Standard competitions. Ruslan and Katusha have performed for celebrities and at significant events such as Capezio's 125th Anniversary Show, and have appeared on major TV networks. They also own Championship Dance Camps and organize the annual Independence Day Ball Dance Camp in Washington, DC. After a break, they returned to competition in 2016, participating in the Austrian Open Championships and the WDSF PD Latin World Championship.



KATUSHA WILDER Judae

Katusha Wilder started dancing at the age of 7 in St. Petersburg, Russia. After getting married to Ruslan Wilder in 2002, the couple continued their dance career together. Since then, they have acquired many various top titles in the United States and around the world in the DanceSport industry. Championships, U.S. Representatives to the World in the Professional 10 Dance Championships, World Professional 10 Dance Championship Finalists, and U.S. Professional Rising Star Standard Finalists.



RICHARD SEMLITZ Master of Ceremonies (MC)


